

**The Brexit Bills** ①

Repeal Bill, Customs Bill, Trade Bill, Immigration Bill, Fisheries Bill, Agriculture Bill, Nuclear Safeguards Bill and International Sanctions Bill.

**Key non-Brexit Bills**

- Automated and Electric Vehicles Bill – Ensure infrastructure is in place to support the 'rapid adoption' of electric vehicles. ②
- Space Industry Bill – Create new powers to license a wide range of new commercial spaceflight with a regulatory framework to manage the market.
- Smart Meter Bill – This extends by five years the powers to make changes to regulations to provide for a smoother rollout.
- (Draft) Tenants' Fees Bill – Bans landlords and letting agents from charging additional fees and introduces a cap for the deposit.
- Civil Liability Bill – Cracking down on whiplash claims.
- (Draft) Patient Safety Bill – Establishing the Health Service Safety Investigation Body (HSSIB) and providing it with powers to conduct investigations into patient safety risks in the NHS in England.

**Key non-legislative measures**

- Conduct a full public inquiry into the Grenfell Tower fire, while guaranteeing to rehouse and compensate all those affected.
- Review the UK counter-terrorism strategy in light of the recent terror attacks in London and Manchester
- Review mental health legislation, with the aim of working towards a new Mental Health Act ③
- Implement measures included in the Paris Agreement on climate change and continue to prioritise energy security and affordability.
- Work to improve adult social care, bringing forward proposals for consultation.
- Address the current unfair funding arrangements in schools and reform technical education.
